I would now like to talk a little bit about the direction I see the FA taking over the next year or so. While I wouldn't say we are trying to be a more activist organization, I would say we are trying to take a more proactive and less reactive approach to our operations and dealings with the college. A new round of bargaining will soon be upon us, which my colleague Phil will talk more about in this newsletter. Beyond that, we are trying to make our presence felt by the college, asking for a seat at the table in important decisions, and taking a more active role on Academic Council, to name just two things. We also will make sure that we communicate regularly and frequently with faculty both about our activities and our responses to what the college might throw our way. We believe that maintaining good relations with college leadership is in the best interest of our faculty, but at the same time we must remember the strength we have and the vital importance of faculty to this institution.

Finally, many have likely noticed that we have been talking about Casual issues more often. This is purposeful, as we recognize that Casual pay has become a real sticking point, and that it's easy for Casuals to feel overlooked both by the college and the FA itself. While I do not want to be in the business of promising more than I can deliver, I will say that Casual concerns are always top of mind, and that during my tenure as president we will strive to do all we can to give Casuals a voice and to better address their concerns.





The Professional Affairs Committee is proud to present our upcoming workshop focused on Teacher Burnout.



bargaining update


As hard as it is to believe, we have begun the bargaining process all over again. Doesn't it seem like we just wrapped up the last one? For context, the LAST Collective Agreement covered the period from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2024; so as you can see from the expiring date, that collective agreement is at the conclusion of THIS academic year.

The first task towards the next round of bargaining was to appoint a new bargaining team for 2024. This year's team will include: Phil Flegel, BVCFA Negotiations Vice President and Bargaining Lead; Penny Marcotte, BVCFA Past President; Kim Smith, BVCFA Labour Relations Specialist; Christie Pettipas, BVCFA VP Operations; and Terry Sway, External Consultant. BVCFA President Matt Kriz will be involved in strategy sessions and debriefs, pre and post bargaining sessions with the Employer.

The significant aspect of this year's bargaining is that all, with the exception of Christie Pettipas, ALL members are returning to the negotiations table which to the BVCFA is a significant strategic advantage for the Association as we have returning veterans that know and understand the process thoroughly.

The bargaining team first meeting was in late October where we discussed bargaining priorities and strategies for the upcoming 2024 negotiations. The bargaining team is in the process of developing a member survey to gauge the membership on what priorities THEY want the team to bring to the table. Expect that survey to be in your mailbox in early 2024.









bargaining update continued

So where do we go from here? Once the survey is released and the results are tabulated, the Bargaining Team will develop a Bargaining Proposal based on those survey results. In April of 2024, I will send to the Employer an "Intent to Bargain" which will officially kick start the process with the College. This then involves an exchange of our proposal and the receipt of their proposal, likely in May 2024. Once is done, we will schedule the actually bargaining sessions in May and June of 2024. If no agreement is made at the end of June 2024, we will pause for summer break and continue into the Fall of 2024. The current collective agreement remains in place until a new agreement is concluded and ratified.

I will be providing periodic updates in the process at both the General Meeting before Christmas and at the Annual General Meeting in the Spring to the membership. Hope to see everyone at these meetings so to understand more of what is happening with YOUR collective agreement.








up for some punch?

Apple Cider Punch

6 cups apple cider
1 cup orange juice
1/2 cup lemon juice
1 cup rum - (or whiskey) *optional*
1 liter ginger ale - (about 4 cups)

Apple Cider Punch Garnishes

2 apples - sliced 1 orange - sliced 10 cinnamon sticks



INSTRUCTIONS

Place apple cider, orange juice and lemon juice in a large pitcher or punch bowl. Stir to combine. If making spiked apple cider punch, add your rum (or whiskey). Toss in sliced apples, oranges and cinnamon sticks. Refrigerate to chill at least one hour. When ready to serve, add ginger ale and pour over glasses filled with ice.
